The 2017 | 2018 Season was incredibly exciting and set the stage for an even brighter future for Atlanta Ballet. Our professional company and dance school are thriving, and both experienced growth during the last season by adding new dancers and performance opportunities, while also expanding the range of our repertoire. Thanks to the success of *The Time is Now* capital campaign, and the 2018 new *Nutcracker* production and the pivotal role it will play in our long-term growth, we are well positioned to take Atlanta Ballet to even greater heights. We also have assembled a dedicated board and staff, collectively working to drive Atlanta Ballet to meet our mission and exceed our organizational goals.

Throughout the 2017 | 2018 Season we presented programming that included beloved classics as well as innovative new works by some of the brightest choreographers working in dance today. Based on increased ticket sales and patron feedback, our audiences loved our programs, and the markedly higher level of dancing was palpable. Our dance school expanded by opening a new location in the Virginia-Highland area, and we added community partners such as Hollis Academy, thus broadening our reach on Atlanta's Westside. We also launched Atlanta Ballet 2 as the top-level of our school, offering training and performance opportunities to dancers on the verge of a professional career.

We are pleased to report that financially, Atlanta Ballet remains strong. Our 2017 | 2018 ticket sales were at an all-time high; we exceeded our fund-raising goals; and our bottom line financial results ended with a surplus. We also received a one-time major gift that will enable us to realize two key elements of our goals – increasing the size of our dance company over the next three years and increasing the size of our studio where the expanded Company can rehearse.

All of these efforts have positioned Atlanta Ballet to continue to grow in both size and stature to be among the top ballet companies in the nation. We aspire to become known for a body of work that is uniquely our own and one that is embraced for inventiveness and the precision, artistry, and passion with which our dancers perform.

Throughout this annual report, we celebrate the 2017 | 2018 Season and thank you for being a part of this extraordinary time in Atlanta Ballet's history. We trust that your investment in Atlanta Ballet provides you with the gift of pride; your support allows us to share the joy of dance with all of Atlanta.



### THE TIME IS NOW:

### THE CAMPAIGN FOR ATLANTA BALLET

In 2014, Atlanta Ballet launched *The Time is Now: The Campaign for Atlanta Ballet* – a \$23.5 million fund-raising campaign focused on access and education, building audiences, and growing the endowment.

During the 2017 | 2018 Season, as part of the building audiences portion of the campaign, we launched a fund-raising effort for the new production of *The Nutcracker*, with a goal of \$6 million.



- Atlanta Ballet trustee Vanessa Delmer and her husband Robin hosted an event on April 28, 2018 to introduce fellow trustees to Yuri Possokhov, choreographer of the new Nutcracker.
- On May 21, 2018, Atlanta Ballet hosted a media preview for the new *Nutcracker*, which included remarks from Atlanta Ballet trustee Chris Carlos, presenting sponsor, and fellow trustee Linda Morris representing PNC, gold sponsor, and a Q & A with Artistic Director Gennadi Nedvigin, choreographer Yuri Possokhov, and lighting designer David Finn.

The Nutcracker is one of our city's most beloved holiday traditions, and we hope to see fellow Atlantans take on the challenge to support this magical new production.

2017 | 2018 marked the second season with Gennadi Nedvigin serving as artistic director. Gennadi brought with him an impeccable dance resumé — from his training at the Bolshoi Ballet Academy to his professional career on stage, including nearly 20 years as a principal dancer with San Francisco Ballet. Upon arriving in Atlanta, Gennadi set forth a bold new artistic

vision for the Company, focused on versatility, excellence, and an emphasis on classical technique. Gennadi has used his vast contacts in the dance world to bring in exciting new choreographers and designers from the US and abroad, presenting a diverse repertoire of new works and familiar classics. With ticket sales at an all-time high, Atlanta's audiences are responding to the balanced mix of traditional and innovative programming that Gennadi is presenting on stage, showcasing his attention to detail and the unique artistry of our Company dancers.

### **CDE Dean Sharon Story Honored**

In July 2018, ArtsATL presented the "Legacy Series: Portraits of 12 extraordinary Atlantans in the arts," which included a feature on Sharon Story, dean of the Atlanta Ballet Centre for Dance Education. The series was created to honor those who have made important and long-standing contributions to the city's arts and cultural landscape. As the dean of the CDE since its founding in 1996, Sharon has helped generations of young dancers grow and develop. Per Sharon, "the Centre for Dance Education has a longstanding base mission of dance for all, where anyone and everyone is welcome to dance from age 2 to 72. The most important thing is to inspire at all levels."







Fulton County issued an official proclamation declaring June 6, 2018 as "Atlanta Ballet Centre for Dance Education Day" to honor the twenty-year partnership with the West End Performing Arts Center, which "promotes dance education, inspires youth, and expands opportunities in dance for underserved communities."

### **ATLANTA BALLET 2**

During the 2017 | 2018 Season, Atlanta Ballet launched Atlanta Ballet 2 (AB2), a pre-professional ensemble that is the highest level of training through our school, the Atlanta Ballet Centre for Dance Education. AB2 provides performance opportunities for students and serves as a training ground for the future generation of dancers, refining young talent and helping them discover the high expectations demanded of professional artists.

AB2 dancers (ages 17-21) receive individual classes and coaching from faculty and the artistic team, and they have opportunities to rehearse with the Company. In addition, the AB2 program nurtures the whole person as an artist – providing access to services such as a psychologist, nutritionists, and the company medical team.

Thirteen dancers made up the inaugural AB2 ensemble, with two advancing from within the school and the remainder coming from all over the world through auditions. AB2 performed the family ballet, *Beauty & the Beast*, which became our highest grossing family ballet in the history of Atlanta Ballet. In addition, the ensemble performed at the High Museum of Art, The Shops Buckhead Atlanta, the CDE's Celebrate. Educate. Dance event at the Cobb Energy Performing Arts Centre, and Healthy Living Day at the Michael C. Carlos Dance Centre. At the end of the season, four AB2 dancers were promoted to the 2018 | 2019 professional Company, one returned to AB2, and the other eight secured professional jobs across the country/world.

### CENTRE FOR DANCE

### EDUCATION

Atlanta Ballet Centre for Dance Education (CDE) was created in 1996 to nurture young dancers and provide an outlet for children and adults to express their creativity. The CDE works to maintain an environment that fosters teamwork, leads to healthy life choices, and promotes self-esteem. The CDE is committed to inspiring excellence, and is fully accredited by the National Association of Schools of Dance (NASD) — one of only nine dance schools in the country.

### CDE Highlights from 2017 | 2018

- Twelve (12) out of 39 Atlanta Ballet Company dancers were trained at the CDE.
- In September 2017 and again in February 2018, Atlanta Ballet 2 presented the one-hour family ballet Beauty & the Beast with ten performances at Infinite Energy Centre and the Cobb Energy Performing Arts Centre (including 2 Kids In Step student matinee series showings).
- In May 2018, the CDE's annual Spring Concert was held at the Cobb Energy Performing Arts Centre. This three-day event with 10 shows offered performance opportunities for 900 students.
- In January 2018, the CDE opened a new location, the Virginia-Highland Centre in Amsterdam Walk.
- 1,796 adults were served in our Adult Open Division, which
  provides a wide variety of ballet and other dance classes geared
  towards students ages 18 & up who wish to start dancing, return
  to a passion for dance, or are looking for a new form of exercise.
- Atlanta Ballet received over \$1 million for arts education and community engagement programs, including \$750,000 from The Molly Blank Fund of The Arthur M. Blank Family Foundation to support all CDE activities and \$300,000 from The Coca-Cola Foundation for a new dance program at the Michael R. Hollis Innovation Academy, thus expanding our presence on the Westside.

### Atlanta Ballet's AileyCamp


A six-week summer program utilizing dance to develop self-esteem, creative expression, and critical thinking skills for at-risk students who are ages 11-14

- In summer 2018, 85 students completed the camp.
- Participants, all of whom attended for free and are under-served in the arts, were recruited from 41 metro-area schools.
- **14 educators and artists** provided instruction for the campers.
- 17 students were offered CDE scholarships to continue their dance studies for the upcoming school year (10 new and 7 returning participants).
- All participants and a family member were offered free tickets to an Atlanta Ballet's Nutcracker performance and the touring Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater show at the Fox Theatre.
- The program is hosted by Charles R. Drew Charter School, with support from The Molly Blank Fund of The Arthur M. Blank Family Foundation, Georgia Power, Wells Fargo, Georgia Council for the Arts, and City of Atlanta Mayor's Office of Cultural Affairs and Power2Give donors.



This summer we celebrated 60 years of Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater and five years in partnership with Atlanta Ballet's summer programs. To commemorate this milestone, students presented 'An Ailey Tribute,' performing six different pieces representing each decade of the company. All participants put forth great effort, hard work and dedication, which was reflected in the final performance, and I was very proud." - Diane Caroll Sales, Director of Atlanta Ballet's

### **Disabilities & Dance**

Dance programs offered for children and adults facing serious illnesses, disabilities, and other social and emotional life challenges

- During the 2017 | 2018 Season, Atlanta Ballet created a new dance class for adults with developmental disabilities (DD). In partnership with the Frazer Center, this program assists adults with DD in discovering different forms of dance while finding enjoyment and health benefits in regular exercise.
- Atlanta Ballet continued its partnership with Camp Twin Lakes (CTL) to implement a summer dance program for 2,500 campers facing serious illnesses, disabilities, and other social and emotional life challenges. Each class is tailored to the specific needs of individual campers based on their levels of mobility and differences, and a final performance at week's end provides an opportunity for campers to demonstrate new dance skills to their peers.
- Both partnerships are supported by The Home Depot Foundation.

### **Costume & Live Music Highlights**

The sets, costumes, and lighting all play crucial roles in bringing a choreographer's vision to life, and during the 2017 | 2018 Season, we were fortunate to have some stunning examples of how these elements enhance a performance.

#### Costumes

• For the world premiere of *Remembrance/Hereafter* in March 2018, choreographer Craig Davidson worked with Kate Venables, a former dancer and costume designer for stage and film, for the costume and scenic design. Kate was inspired by the story behind Craig's piece, which explores the memories we hold after people pass on and the imprints they leave behind. Kate used a transfer technique called bundle dying to imbue the fabric of the costumes with the colors, essence, and textures of flowers. Our costume shop skillfully arranged rose and butterfly pea petals, eucalyptus leaves, and onion skins on fabric, which was then rolled and steamed for two hours. After two weeks, the bundles were unfurled to reveal a kaleidoscope of organic patterns and colors from the natural dying process used to convey the story of Craig's work.

#### **Live Music**

- The May 2018 program included the world premiere of Concerto Armonico by Mariinsky Theatre's Maxim Petrov, making his North American choreographic debut with Atlanta Ballet. The work was driven by the powerful, dynamic musical score, a concerto composed for harmonica and orchestra. We were fortunate to have Robert Bonfiglio as the featured harmonica player, who presented this unusual piece to dramatic effect.
- For Remembrance/Hereafter, Craig Davidson selected Franz Schubert's dramatic "Death and the Maiden." This haunting music created an ethereal feel for his moving piece.
- For Tara Lee's blink, she selected world-renowned pianist Di Wu to perform
  the music by Johannes Brahms. Ms. Wu executed this difficult piece beautifully, contributing to the awe felt by the audience at this world premiere.


